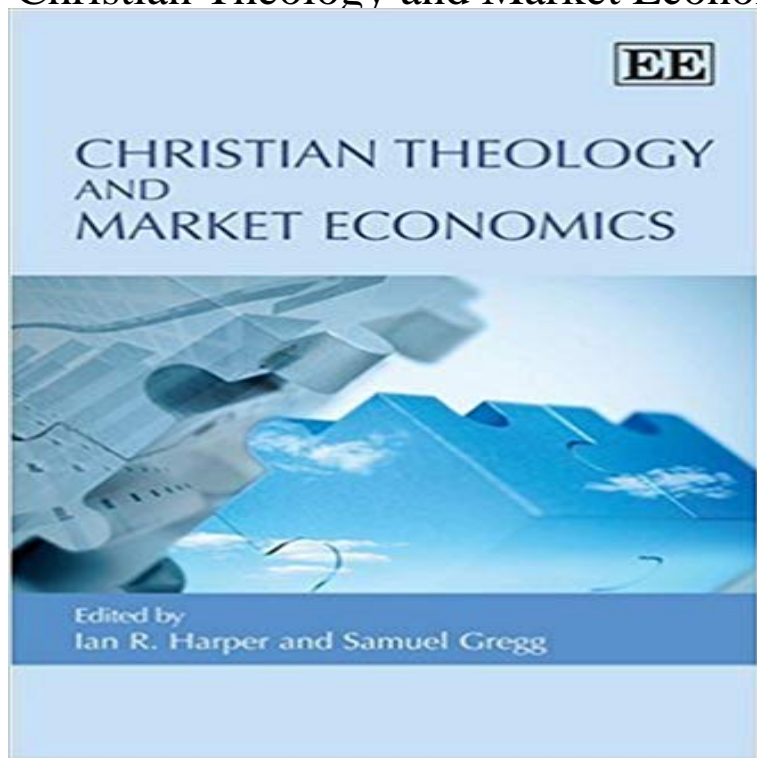


Christian Theology and Market Economics
