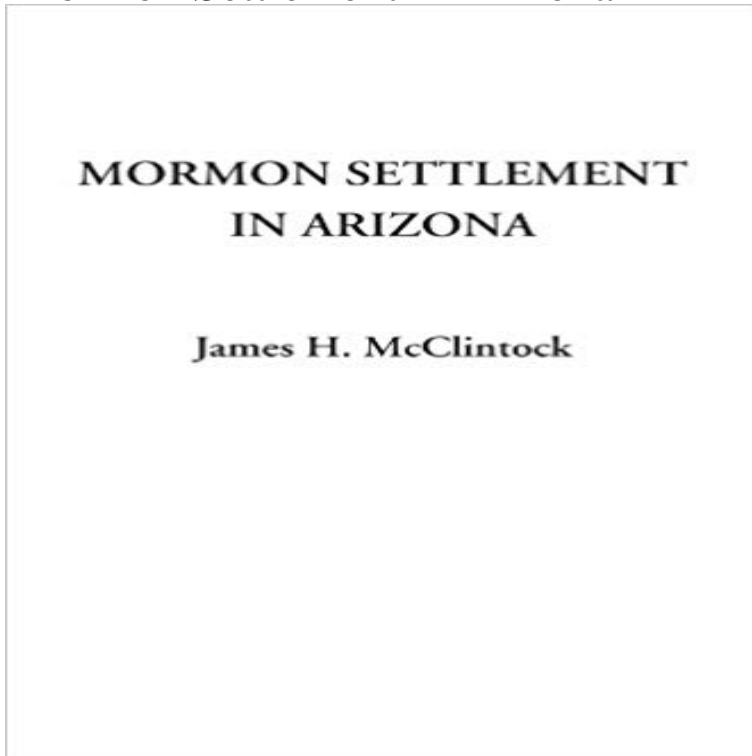


## Mormon Settlement in Arizona
